<u>Section 4</u>: The **Chair** shall preside at all Alliance meetings. The Chair, in consultation with the Board of Directors shall:

- Authorize task force group leaders and subcommittees as needed to carry out the activities of the Alliance
- Supervise the activities of the membership
- Prepare descriptions for all officer positions
- Ensure Alliance Bylaws are complete and updated.
- Perform the duties inherent in the office of Chair subject to the direction of the Board

<u>Section 5:</u> The **Vice Chair** shall act for the Chair and preside at meetings in the absence of the Chair. The Vice Chair shall perform the duties inherent in the office of Vice Chair subject to the direction of the Board.

<u>Section 6</u>: The **Secretary**, or designee, subject to the approval of the officers, shall:

- *Keep minutes of all meetings.*
- Ensure all required notices are sent, including agendas
- Ensure that the Alliance website is up to date with minutes, agendas and related documentation of the Alliance Board and Focus Groups.
- Perform the duties inherent in the office of the Secretary subject to the direction of the Chair or the Alliance.

<u>Section 7:</u> The **Treasurer**, or designee subject to the approval of the officers, shall:

- See to the custody of all funds, securities, books of account and financial records of the Alliance. Provide for receiving monies.
- See to the deposit of these moneys in such banks, trust companies, and other depositories as shall be selected by the officers.
- See to such payments and other financial obligations of the Alliance as may be determined necessary, convenient or proper to be made on behalf of the Alliance,
- Exhibit the books of the Alliance at all reasonable times to any member of the Alliance.
- *Make regular written reports to the Chair and officers at each scheduled meeting.*
- Perform the duties inherent in the office of the Treasurer subject to the direction of the Chair or the Alliance.

DEC Program update: John Flannigan, Vermont Criminal Justice Training Council, Vermont Drug Evaluation & Classification Program, State Coordinator

VT DECP Summary

- 1. We currently have 53 DREs statewide. We were fortunate to get a class and field certifications done in Jan / Feb before the pandemic hit. This added 11 new DREs to the field across the state.
- 2. With COVID-19, we thought our calls may decrease, but we had a slight slowdown in March-April and since May calls have been up. The VT DEC program has logged approximately 330 enforcement evaluations to date, that is about 14% higher than this time last year.
- 3. We've had 215 DRE Alerts that requested a response for a DRE. 85% of those requests a DRE was available to respond to.
- 4. Re-certification training was cancelled in June, but we have provided webinar options and we currently are planning a December virtual recertification training class.
- 5. We continue to see Cannabis, Narcotic Analgesic and CNS Depressant drugs as our top three drug categories that are confirmed in toxicology. However, we are seeing substantial increases in the CNS Stimulant category, especially in Cocaine and Methamphetamine.
- 6. 25% of the DIEs done are cases that involved a crash.
- 7. We are tentatively planning our next DRE school in the Spring of 2021.
- 8. ARIDE There were some earlier classes cancelled this year, but we have just had a few classes done lately, including an ARIDE refresher class being offered today at Colchester PD, that was filled to capacity. We will continue to offer these in person classes with protective measures regionally into 2021.
- 9. We are sending (2) DREs to DRE Instructor training in January to the Maine Police Academy.
- 10. We are replacing approximately 35 aging android tablets to the field for DREs to do their DIE electronically. Thanks to the HSO for making that possible.
- 11. Finally, it appears that S.54 went into law without the governor's signature at midnight. Sadly, this contains no provision for roadside drug testing and really doesn't do much to improve highway safety.

SHSO Update: Allison Laflamme, Administrator, State Highway Safety Office (see attached PP for more details)

Compliments to NHSTA for help and understanding of challenges due to COVID Vt. HSP submitted July 2020 and approved in August. Advanced notices to proceed have gone out for FY2021 grants. Noted that VT has been lucky (diligent) about COVID, so the State has been able to continue and implement important initiatives. There is a new project for distracted driving signage. The LEL's will work with schools for getting the signs distributed and installed. Impaired driving summit planned for the spring. Another new two year project, Shift Vermont, is planned for advertising with positive messaging. Highway Safety Award nominations are being solicited. These are due October 16th. Please submit a nomination and contact rachel.noyes@vermont.gov for more information. The SHSO was a part of 9 bill reviews.
